MOLINE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Tuesday, June 4, 2019

Council Meeting: The City Council meeting came to order at 7:40 p.m. The Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

Pledge: The Council and audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Invocation: Alderman Wendt gave an Invocation.

Roll Call: Roll call was taken with Mayor Acri, Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

Items on Consent:

Approval of Minutes

Committee-of-the-Whole and Council meeting minutes of May 21, 2019, and appointments made during Committee-of-the-Whole on June 4, 2019.

Resolutions

1. Council Bill/Resolution 1066-2019

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute an agreement to accept funding and to do all things necessary to execute all assurances and certifications to the Illinois Housing Development Authority for the Abandoned Residential Property Municipal Relief Program in the amount of \$33,400; and authorizing the Planning and Development Department to begin work upon the execution of the agreement between the City and the Illinois Housing Development Authority to accept funding for the Abandoned Residential Property Municipal Relief Program in the amount of \$33,400, and to do all things necessary to implement said program requirements.

2. Council Bill/Resolution 1067-2019

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to make application, to enter into an agreement, and to execute all necessary assurances and certifications to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for Community Development Block Grant entitlement funding under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, of certain projects and programs for fiscal year 2019; and approving projects & program recommendations of the Citizens Advisory Council on Urban Policy for the use of 2019 Community Development Block Grant funds and the 2019 Annual Action Plan, which contains said projects and programs; and authorizing the Mayor to implement those approved projects and programs upon the approval of the City of Moline 2019 Annual Action Plan by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and to exercise any and all powers required to obtain such funding and to implement those approved projects.

3. Council Bill/Resolution 1068-2019

A Resolution approving proposed amendments to the 2017 and 2018 CDBG Annual Action Plan for the purpose of fund reallocation.

Omnibus Vote: Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved to establish the Consent Agenda with Items 1-3. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none. Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt,

moved to approve the Consent Agenda as established. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

Items Not on Consent:

First Reading Ordinances

1. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3016-2019

An Ordinance amending Chapter 5, “AMUSEMENTS,” of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Article I, “VIDEO GAMING,” by repealing said article in its entirety and enacting in lieu thereof one new Article I relating to the same subject matter; and Chapter 3, “ADVERTISING AND SIGNS,” of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Table 3-2105.1 of Section 3-2105, by adding video gaming exception provisions to the table’s footnotes for temporary signs (f) and banners (g).

Council, Staff and Citizen Comments:

Alderman Potter, stated that school children are utilizing a new sidewalk at 24th Avenue between 30th Street and 34th Street, however residents have noted that it is creating a hazard for crossing. Alderman Potter, seconded by Alderman Berg, moved to direct staff to investigate the possibility of placing a signalized pedestrian crossing at 24th Avenue and 34th Street. City Engineer Scott Hinton indicated that a push button signal may be appropriate at this location, and staff will investigate.

Alderman Berg thanked Police staff for saving a family of ducks on John Deere Road recently.

Executive Session:

Alderman Berg, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved for Executive Session, for the purpose of discussion of Price Setting for Sale or Lease of Real Property-5 ILCS 120/2 (C) (6). Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.


City Council convened in Executive Session at 8:02 p.m.
