MOLINE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

City Hall, 619 16th Street
Tuesday, October 22, 2019

Council Meeting: The City Council meeting came to order at 7:03 p.m. The Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

Pledge: The Council and audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Invocation: Alderman Parker gave an Invocation.

Roll Call: Roll call was taken with Mayor Acri, Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg present. Absent: None.

Items on Consent:

Approval of Minutes & September Financial Report

Committee-of-the-Whole and Council meeting minutes of October 15, 2019, and the September Financial Report.

Omnibus Vote: Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved to approve and adopt, by omnibus vote, these items. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

Items Not on Consent:

First Reading Ordinances

1. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3027-2019

An Ordinance amending Chapter 2, "ADMINISTRATION," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Sec. 2-2400, "STAFF TRAFFIC COMMITTEE; COUNCIL REVIEW," by repealing subsections (a) and (b) in their entirety and enacting in lieu thereof new subsections (a), (b) and (c) relating to the same subject matter; and amending Chapter 20, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, as follows: by repealing Sec. 20-2156, "PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING; RESIDENTIAL," in its entirety and enacting in lieu thereof one new Sec. 20-2156, "DESIGNATED PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES; RESIDENTIAL," relating to the same subject matter; by repealing in its entirety Sec. 20-5124(b), referencing Appendix 24 as a listing of persons with disabilities parking spaces within the City, and consecutively renaming the remaining subsection of Sec. 20-5124 as subsection (b); and by repealing Appendix 24 in its entirety.

Council, Staff and Citizen Comments:

Bryon Lear, Library Director, shared that Friends of the Moline Public Library is having its annual raffle basket and silent auction fundraising event every day this week from 10-5, and on Saturday, October 26, from 10-2. Friends of the Moline Public Library is also having its Fall Overflow Book Sale on Friday, October 25, from 12-4, and on Saturday, October 26, from 9-2.

Darren Gault, Chief of Police, presented an update on a couple of community outreach programs. First, the Police and Fire Departments recently closed on their Pink Out Campaign to raise money for cancer and, specifically, breast cancer awareness. On Friday, October 25, Chief Gault and Fire Chief Jeff Snyder will present the Moline YMCA with a \$1,200 check for the Live Strong Program to support those fighting cancer. Secondly, in November, the Police Department will be participating in the No-Shave November Campaign. As

such, Chief Gault has authorized a deviation from the standard uniform until December 2. Officers and other members of the Police Department will be allowed to grow beards in exchange for a \$30 donation to the No-Shave November Campaign. Numerous area police departments are taking part in this event. This year's proceeds will be donated to the University of Iowa Stead Family Children's Hospital.

Mayor Acri mentioned that K.J. Whitley, Community Development Program Manager, hosted a great event today. Joseph P. Galvan, the Midwest Regional Administrator of the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD), was at Moline City Hall to present a formal award of the lead grant to the City of Moline. Ms. Whitley is leading the facilitation of the lead grant and fielded questions during the question and answer portion of the event.

Executive Session:

Alderman Berg, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved for Executive Session, for the purpose of discussion of Collective Negotiating Matters-5 ILCS 120/2(C)(2) and Appointment, Employment, Compensation, Discipline, Performance, or Dismissal of Specific Employees-5 ILCS 120/2(C)(1). Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

City Council convened in Executive Session at 7:11 p.m.

Alderman Potter, seconded by Alderman Berg, moved to adjourn Executive Session. Council reconvened in open session at 8:58 p.m.

On motion of Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Berg, Council adjourned at 8:58 p.m.
