MOLINE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Tuesday, April 14, 2020

Council Meeting: The City Council meeting came to order at 8:56 p.m. The Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

Pledge: The Council and audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Invocation: There was no Invocation.

Roll Call: Roll call was taken with Mayor Acri, Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg present. Absent: None.

Items on Consent:

Approval of Minutes and Appointment Made

Committee-of-the-Whole and Council meeting minutes of April 14, 2020, and the appointment made during Committee-of-the-Whole on April 14, 2020.

Resolutions

1. Council Bill/Resolution 1050-2020

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute and attest to Addendum No. 1 to the Law Enforcement Services Agreement between the City of Moline and Universal Protection Service, LLC d/b/a Allied Universal Security Services, modifying the terms for assignment of uniformed police officers to the SouthPark Mall complex.

2. Council Bill/Resolution 1051-2020

A Resolution modifying the City of Moline's personnel code temporarily to impose a moratorium on the hiring of new personnel to the City of Moline pursuant to the COVID-19 pandemic state of emergency and its negative economic impacts.

Omnibus Vote: Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved to approve, by omnibus vote, these items. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

3. Council Bill/Resolution 1052-2020

A Resolution establishing a City of Moline policy entitled Temporary Remote Attendance and Public Comment Policy pursuant to the COVID-19 pandemic state of emergency.

Approved: Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved to approve Council Bill 1052-2020. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

First Reading Ordinances

4. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3012-2020

An Ordinance amending Chapter 22, "OFFENSES-MISCELLANEOUS," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Article I, by enacting one new Division 7 entitled "Registration of Certain Offenders."

5. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3013-2020

An Ordinance amending Chapter 4, “ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR,” of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Section 4-4110, “SALES OF SINGLE SERVING CONTAINERS OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS,” to clarify that the regulation of retail sale of single serving containers of certain alcoholic liquors in their original packaging pertains to off-premises consumption.

Motion for Consideration: Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved to consider Council Bill 3013-2020. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

Adopted: Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved to adopt Council Bill 3013-2020. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Williams, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Moyer, Schoonmaker, Waldron and Berg; nays: none.

6. Council Bill/Special Ordinance 4006-2020

A Special Ordinance granting a temporary modification to Section 28-3200(a) and Section 35-4218 of the Moline Code of Ordinances to permanently waive the installation of sidewalks for property located along 36th Avenue Court, pursuant to an application submitted by Haversian Canal Systems, LLP (ORA Orthopedics), 510 Valley View Drive, Moline.

Council, Staff and Citizen Comments:

Alderman Parker noted that a Council meeting is not scheduled for April 28th, and inquired if this is a good time to skip a week. Mayor Acri proposed that GovHR Consultant Mark Peterson be engaged to facilitate a special work session on May 12th to address long-term effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting policies.

Mayor Acri received Council approval to proceed with the planning of a virtual State of the City event.

Alderman Wendt thanked the first responders who cared for his mother recently.


Alderman Waldron thanked Interim City Administrator J.D. Schulte and staff for their effort to make further budget cuts.
