## AN ORDINANCE

**AMENDING** 

Chapter 20 "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Appendix 3 thereof, "PEDESTRIAN CROSSING SIGNALS," by including Midblock on 48<sup>th</sup> Street, 675 feet south of 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue; Midblock on River Drive on the west side of the intersection of 41<sup>st</sup> Street; Midblock on River Drive, 935 feet east of 25<sup>th</sup> Street; Midblock on 53<sup>rd</sup> Street, 175 feet north of 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue; Midblock on 53<sup>rd</sup> Street, 200 feet north of 36<sup>th</sup> Avenue Court; and Midblock on 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 1080 feet west of 7<sup>th</sup> Street (East Moline).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOLINE, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u> – That Chapter 20, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Appendix 3 thereof, "PEDESTRIAN CROSSING SIGNALS," by including Midblock on 48<sup>th</sup> Street, 675 feet south of 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue; Midblock on River Drive on the west side of the intersection of 41<sup>st</sup> Street; Midblock on River Drive, 935 feet east of 25<sup>th</sup> Street; Midblock on 53<sup>rd</sup> Street, 175 feet north of 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue; Midblock on 53<sup>rd</sup> Street, 200 feet north of 36<sup>th</sup> Avenue Court; and Midblock on 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 1080 feet west of 7<sup>th</sup> Street (East Moline).

<u>Section 2</u> – That pursuant to Section 1-1107 of the Moline Code of Ordinances, any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for each offense.

<u>Section 3</u> – That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; and, if required by law, publication in the manner provided for by law.
