

Moline Recycles! *A Guide to Recycling Programs*

Dear Moline Resident,

On March 31, 2008, Moline will begin to offer its residents the convenience of curbside recycling. I am pleased that our city, the largest community in the Illinois Quad Cities, is stepping up and taking the lead by implementing such an important program. It is the first step in becoming a greener city and becoming responsible caretakers of our community and our earth.

In our throw away society, Moline generates 17,500 tons of trash annually at a cost of over \$264,000 in landfill charges. At a minimum, 25 percent of our waste can be recycled through the implementation of a single stream curbside recycling program.

This brochure explains the new curbside recycling program and also provides other useful recycling information. I hope you will find it handy for future reference.

As Mayor of Moline, I invite you to join me in the recycling effort. Your participation will help to ensure that our community and our environment are preserved for future generations.

Midland Davis Curbside Recycling Collection

- All curbside recycling questions should be directed to Midland Davis by calling **309-277-1625**.
- Beginning March 31, 2008, if you are currently receiving garbage collection from the City of Moline, you will automatically receive curbside recycling at a charge of \$2.56 per month on your water bill.
- Recycling will be collected every other week on your regularly scheduled day of garbage collection.
- **If your cart lid has the word “white” on it, your start date is March 31. If your cart lid has the word “maroon” on it, your start date is April 7. Please refer to the map on the reverse side.**
- For ease of use, the Moline recycling program is single stream, meaning all of your recyclables go into one cart for collection. (No glass)
- On your recycle week, place your 48 gallon blue recycle cart at the curb three feet from your garbage cart.
- Detailed instructions about items that can be recycled will be provided on the lid of your new recycling cart.

City Carton Recycling Drop-Off Recycling Program

- All drop-off recycling questions should be directed to City Carton Recycling by calling **563-322-6530**.
- If you do not receive the curbside recycling service, a drop-off recycling center has been provided for your convenience.
- Beginning March 31, 2008, Moline will have one drop-off recycling center located at 3635 4th Avenue, Moline near the Municipal Services Center.
- The drop-off recycling center is a dual stream program, meaning that there is one container for all paper products and another for comingled aluminum, tin, plastic, and glass recyclables. □
- Paper recyclables accepted at the drop-off center include newspaper and magazines, telephone books, cereal boxes, corrugated cardboard, and chip board.
- Comingled recyclables accepted at the drop-off center include glass, aluminum, tin, and plastic.
- Items **not** accepted at the drop-off center (or curbside) include: aerosol cans, paint cans, plastic bags, children’s wading pools, batteries, tires, appliances, hazardous or bio waste, food and lawn waste.

Recycle - Do’s and Don’ts

- Glass is not accepted in the curbside recycling program.
- Follow the recycle directions provided on the lid of your recycle cart or on the recycle containers at the drop-off center.
- Rinse out all cans and containers before recycling them.
- Labels on cans are OK but throw the sharp lids away.
- Throw away food contaminated paper and foil.
- Break down cardboard so it will fit and save space in your curbside recycling cart and to save space at the drop-off center.

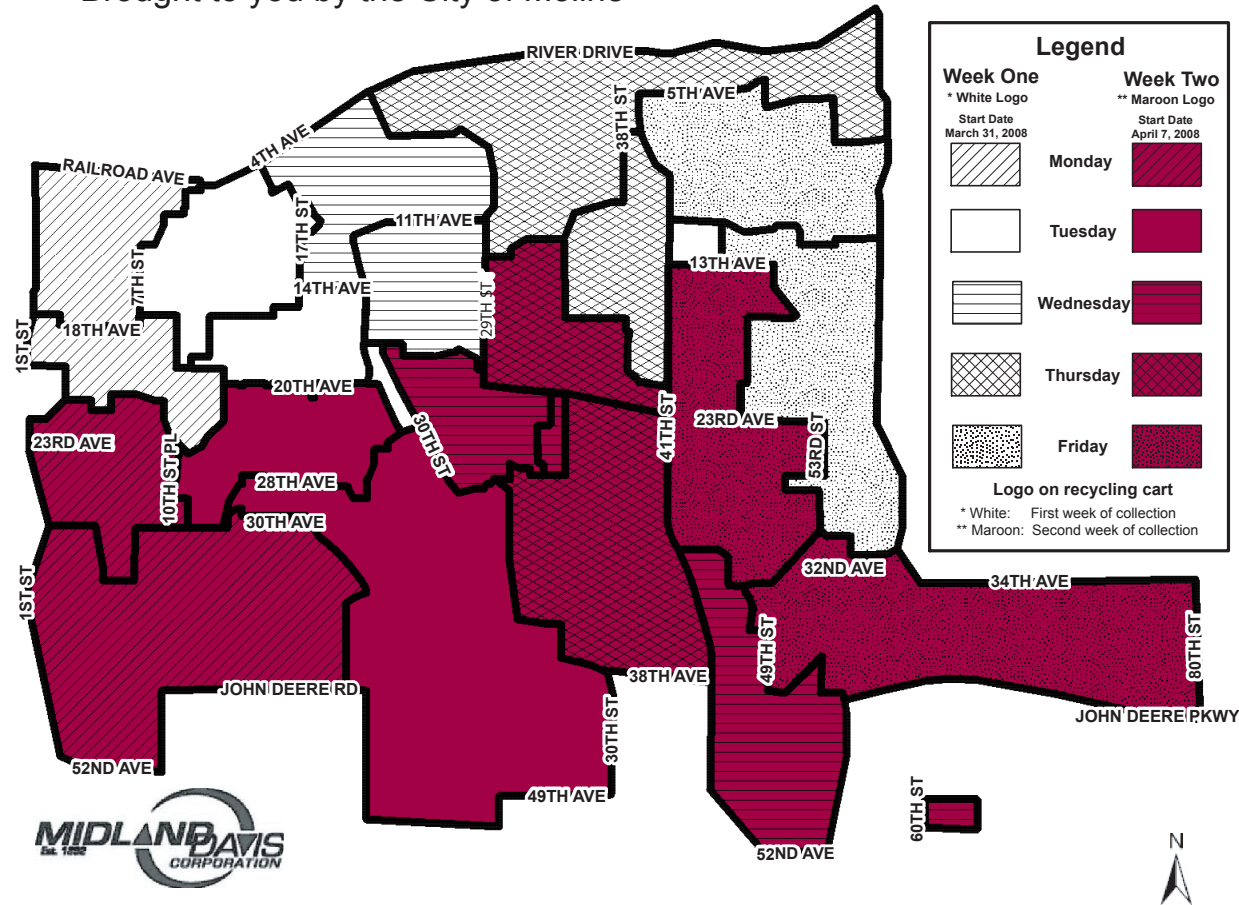

Other Important Recycling and Solid Waste Information

- To recycle tires, call 1-800-917-1969. Limit of 10 tires per household, per year. Free.
- To recycle household appliances/white goods, call 1-800-917-1969. Limit of 4 per household, per year. Free.
- To recycle E-waste such as computers, printers, televisions and radios, call the Electronic Demanufacturing Facility, 563-823-0119. No charge for Rock Island County Residents.
- To recycle household hazardous waste, such as paint, solvents, pesticides or cleaners at no charge, call Scott Area Landfill at 563-381-1300.
- Batteries may be taken to Batteries Plus, 4105 44th Avenue, Moline, at no charge.
- Motor oil can be taken to AutoZone, 4161 Ave. of the Cities and Advance Auto Parts, 4114 Ave. of the Cities, Moline. Limit of 5 gallons per day, at no charge. Western Auto Stores, 1212 2nd Avenue, Rapids City, (309-496-2200) will take 2 gallons max. of antifreeze at 60 cents per gallon. Must be in a sealed container.
- To recycle concrete, call Tri City Black Top at 563-359-3491. Free.
- Plastic loose fill, bubble wrap and packaging peanuts may be recycled at Mailboxes & Parcel Depot, 4343 - 16th Street, Moline and SellPro, 3030 State Street, Bettendorf. Free.
