MOLINE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

City Hall, 619 16th Street
Tuesday, March 27, 2018

Council Meeting: The City Council meeting came to order at 7:23 p.m. The Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

Pledge: The Council and audience recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Invocation: Alderman Schoonmaker gave an Invocation.

Roll Call: Roll call was taken with Mayor Acri, Aldermen Rodriguez, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Turner, Schoonmaker, and Berg present. Absent: Alderman Waldron.

Items on Consent:

Approval of Minutes & Appointments

Committee-of-the-Whole and Council meeting minutes of March 13, 2018, and appointments made during Committee-of-the-Whole on March 27, 2018.

Resolutions

1. Council Bill/Resolution 1045-2018

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute an Agreement for Professional Services with Missman, Inc., an affiliate of IMEG Corporation, for design services related to Project #1298, Airport Pump Station Replacement at 75th Avenue.

2. Council Bill/Resolution 1046-2018

A Resolution authorizing approval of an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of East Moline and the City of Silvis for the existing Moline and East Moline public safety communications center (the "Center") to provide temporary dispatch services for the City of Silvis.

3. Council Bill/Resolution 1047-2018

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute an Administrative Order on Consent issued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Omnibus Vote: Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved to approve and adopt, by omnibus vote, these items. Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: ayes: Aldermen Rodriguez, Parker, Wendt, Potter, Turner, Schoonmaker, and Berg; nays: none.

Items Not on Consent:

First Reading Ordinances

1. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3007-2018

An Ordinance amending Chapter 20, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Section 20-5124, "UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS USING PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING SPACES; A VIOLATION," Appendix 24, "PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PARKING SPACES," by removing one on-street stall at the following locations: 1918 9th Street and 1628 28th Avenue.

2. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3008-2018

An Ordinance amending Chapter 20, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Section 20-4201, "SPECIAL SPEED LIMITS WHILE PASSING SCHOOLS," Appendix

35 thereof, “ALTERED SPEED LIMITS,” by adding 19th Avenue, from 9th Street to 13th Street.

3. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3009-2018

An Ordinance amending Chapter 20, “MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC,” of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Appendix 18 thereof, “TWO-HOUR PARKING RESTRICTIONS IN NONMETERED ZONES,” by removing 8th Avenue, on the north side, from 16th Street to 18th Street.

4. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3010-2018

An Ordinance amending Chapter 20, “MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC,” of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Appendix 10 thereof, “PARKING PROHIBITED AT ANY TIME,” by removing the following locations: 8th Avenue, on the north side, adjacent to the City parking lot between 16th Street and 17th Street; and 8th Avenue, on the south side, from 16th Street east to the police department drive.

5. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3011-2018

An Ordinance amending Chapter 20, “MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC,” of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Appendix 10 thereof, “PARKING PROHIBITED AT ANY TIME,” by including 8th Avenue, on the north side, beginning 50’ east of 16th Street for a length of 40’.

6. Council Bill/General Ordinance 3012-2018

A Ordinance amending Chapter 35 “ZONING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT” of the Moline Code of Ordinances, Table 35-3408 “Principal Commercial Land Uses,” “Land Use Regulations”

Council, Staff and Citizen Comments:

Alderman Wendt shared that four or five commercial properties have been victimized by graffiti. It has been 15 days since notices were served, and clean-up has not been done. Alderman Wendt requested that the number of days allowed for cleanup be changed from 15 days to 7 days. Staff will make the change and present an amendment to Council.

Alderman Rodriguez recognized the City’s recent efforts to improve recycling and shared that recently, trash containers at Stephens Park were overflowing with recyclable material. He suggested adding recycling containers to destination parks and possibly expanding to others. Director of Public Works J.D. Schulte stated that he will work with Parks Director Lori Wilson on the issue and report back to Council.

Alderman Parker asked for a report from City Administrator Doug Maxeiner and staff on the impact of the deer hunt on traffic accidents.

Alderman Turner reported that Parks and Recreation Easter Egg Hunt was successful, despite the snow, with approximately 70 attendees.

Ron Miller, resident, shared concern that the 19th Street construction barricades come too soon after the traffic light at 23rd Avenue. He fears that accidents will happen if they have not already. Public Works Director J.D. Schulte gave assurances that the issue would be addressed.

Executive Session:

Alderman Parker, seconded by Alderman Wendt, moved for Executive Session, for the purpose of discussion of Pending, Probable or Imminent Litigation-5 ILCS 120/2(C)(11) and Price Setting for Sale or Lease of Real Property-5 ILCS 120/2(C)(6). Motion carried on roll call with the following vote: Ayes: Aldermen Parker, Wendt, Potter, Turner, Schoonmaker, and Berg; nays: Alderman Rodriguez.

City Council convened in Executive Session at 7:41 p.m.

Alderman Parker moved to adjourn Executive Session, seconded by Alderman Wendt. Motion passed unanimously.

Council reconvened in open session at 8:13p.m.

Other

Alderman Berg asked to amend the minutes from the March 13, 2018 City Council meeting. She wishes to change her vote from nay to aye on Council Bill 1037-2018, the Midland Contract. The Mayor and City Attorney Riggs advised that the minutes could not be amended as they must reflect what occurred.

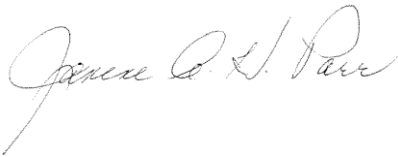
